Florence Rollino at 45 Wells Ct., Bloomfield, started her own landscaped-designed garden about 10 years ago and for the past two years has included a 16 x 24-foot working 'farm' within the landscape design. She grows many, many tomatoes for 'home-drying' as well as for sauce, along with many other veggies.

Toni Spiotta at 517 Watchung Ave., Bloomfield, in her second year of gardening has raised beds with lettuces, carrots, cabbage and beets. In her surrounding ground she has tomatoes, basil and a trellis holding malabar spinach and summer squash.

Necole Fabris, 8 Prospect Pl, West Orange, composts, uses leaves and grass clippings as ground cover, and uses natural pest control in her garden that provides 80% of her family's produce in the summer. She has had a rain barrel for several years.

Pat Kenschaft at 56 Gordonhurst Ave., Montclair, has raised almost all her family's vegetables year round for decades with no poisons, commercial fertilizers, or power

machinery. She also does all her property care with no poisons, commercial fertilizers, mower machinery or watering. There will be environmental displays in her front yard. Last tour starts at 10:30.

Grace Grund at 3 Dodd St., Montclair, raises chickens, whose eggs feed her family along with the vegetables in their organic garden.

Rose Shaw at 19 Valley Rd., Montclair, has a 4' x 4' square-foot garden with peas, Brussels sprouts, peppers, bok choy, celery, potatoes, chives, spinach, and amazing lettuce on the side of the church lawn.

Alan Smith has an informal front yard garden at 148 Forest St., Montclair. He won't be home to answer questions, but you are welcome to stop by to see the garden.
